The Grace of Giving - by Pastor David Piscatelli

Genesis 1:27-28 So God created human beings in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. ²⁸And God blessed them. And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth." Matthew 2:1-3 & 10-11 - Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem,² saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."...¹⁰ When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy.¹¹ And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh.

From the very beginning of time giving has been a part of the work of God. God gives the world boundaries for water and land as well as day and night. God gives us birds, fish, plants, and animals. Then God gives us life, creating human beings: men and women in the very image of God. Our genetics, personalities, and talents are all part of what makes each one of us a child of God. Right after Jesus is born, the wise men came to give gifts to Jesus. They took the long journey to see God's greatest gift—Jesus, the Savior of the World, lying in a manger. They followed the star and fell down to worship Him with their adoration, their actions, and their treasures. Giving is part of the nature of a God who is loving, generous, and kind. Giving is also part of the nature of who God created us to be. Moreover, God invites us to actively participate in His work in the world. Adam and Eve were told to be fruitful and multiply as they live as stewards over God's creation. The wise men gave an act of worship out of the resources that God had provided them. When God gives us the *Grace of Giving* it is invited to be shared.

January is when our stewardship program takes place at Nichols UMC and our theme this year is *The Grace of Giving*. Everything that we have and everything that we are comes from a generous God who loves to give. God gives to us so that others may come to feel God's blessings through the words we speak and the way we live. God has provided each one of us with personalities, resources, and the DNA to do the work that God has called us to do. Whether our resources are abundant or very meager, God invites us to consider how what we have can be used in His Kingdom for ministry. While our participation might vary, the *Grace of Giving* is always part of who we are called to be.

As the calendar turns over and another year begins, there are new challenges and opportunities ahead. Ministry is constantly moving toward the needs that are presented. Thankfully, the *Grace of Giving* continues to be a part of the world around us. God is giving us this time and space to do the work that He wants us to do as an active and thriving congregation. We are not alone in this work; God is with us and has given us each other to share the stewardship responsibilities. God has provided all that we need; His gifts are everywhere! We are invited to follow where God leads and worship God with the resources that He has given us, just like the wise men. What treasures has God given us that we can share in ministry to the broken world? What blessings has God provided to us to reach out to the lost, the hurting, the broken, and the downtrodden.

God wants us to know Him, love Him, and serve Him by making God's love known in the world around us. As the new year begins, we are all invited to consider how the *Grace of Giving* might make a difference in 2023. It is my hope and prayer that we take time to reflect on how sharing in the gift of giving can help transform and heal a broken world that needs Him desperately.

Happy New Year from the Finance Committee. As we enter the new year and approach the annual Stewardship campaign, the Finance Team wants to remind you about several convenient and secure ways to donate gifts to the church.

Venmo – Let's you use a mobile device to pay an individual or organization electronically once you've set up an account. Venmo is a service of PayPal and is an App that can be downloaded from Venmo.com. The NUMC Venmo address is

@NicholsUnitedMethodist-Church. You will see the picture of the church to verify you are in the right place.

Vanco - Vanco e-Service Payments allows you to transfer funds directly into the church's bank account. You can set up a debit from your bank account or pay with a credit card as either a onetime gift or as a recurring gift. The secure Vanco website can be reached by clicking the "OnLine Giving" menu on the homepage of the church's website (www.nicholsumc.org).

Appreciated securities –We now use JP Morgan Chase Bank as our broker. If you plan to donate stock to the church, please contact the church office for details contained in our one-page flyer. The flyer has the codes your broker will need to set up the transfer. Please let the office know what you are transferring so we can confirm its arrival and direct it to the proper account.

Qualified Charitable Distributions - A qualified charitable distribution (QCD) is a distribution from your IRA. You must be age 70¹/₂ or older to make a QCD. A QCD is not taxed, nor is it included in your taxable income, and it counts towards your annual required minimum distribution. The funds must go directly from your account to the church.

Thank you for your continued generosity in support of our missions and ministries. We hope you experience the grace of giving as spoken by Paul in 2 Corinthians - "Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 
