### Final Words - by Pastor David Piscatelli

**NRS Philippians 4:8-9** Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. <sup>9</sup> Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

The apostle Paul wrote more books of the Bible than anyone else. While they were not Old Testament History, Prophets, Gospels, Psalms or other poetry, his letters were some of the most important documents for the early church. Paul wrote letters to churches he helped start, some that he visited, and some that he never met. Paul sought to help these churches be the people that God wanted them to be. Yet in all things, he always entrusted them to the care of God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Paul was faithful to God's call in his life to bring the message of Jesus everywhere he went and understood that his role was to go to the places where God sent him. In his letter to the Philippians, Paul shares his final words to this faithful church, a church he actively participated in. He challenged them to always think about the things that are pure, honorable, pleasing, and praiseworthy to the Lord. AND keep on doing the things they have learned and received from God – that God's peace would be with them.

I'm certainly not as eloquent as Paul, though sometimes I might be just as wordy. I can't think of a better passage to use in my last Carillon article as your Senior Pastor. These will not be my final words, as I will save those for my sermon on June 25th. I am not your first pastor and now we know I won't be your last pastor. In the United Methodist Church, pastors agree to go to the places where God sends us through the appointment system. That system brought me here in July 2014 and will bring Pastor Albert in July 2023. God was already at work in this congregation when I arrived. We have been through a lot together. We have shared many laughs and joys. We have shared many sorrows and tears. In my time here, we have experienced numerous baptisms, new members, weddings, and fellowship events. We have said goodbye to loved ones, endured a worldwide pandemic, and have seen our denomination begin to split. We have welcomed many new faces into leadership and moved others into new roles that allow them to share their God-given gifts effectively. And through all of those things, we have continued to minister to people in need and reach out to those who sought to have their faith and hope restored. That is answering the call to discipleship.

While many congregations in this area and around the world have struggled to survive, you have thrived! You have been a faithful congregation showing love to one another, to the outside world, and to me and Holly. You have served Jesus Christ with your words and your actions. Yet, God is not done with any of us yet! As we all handle the goodbye and welcome transitions of pastoral changes over the next few months, I leave trusting that God will lead us all to the places and people that need to experience the good news of Jesus Christ. As I mentioned in my Carillon article last month, God is always on the move!

So my friends, I wish you endless amounts of God's peace!! Continue to strive to be the people that God wants you to be! I pray that under Pastor Albert's leadership you will continue the work of Jesus Christ by allowing the Holy Spirit to work in you and through you. Strive to be His excellent disciples that by your words and work others may experience the goodness of God and salvation through Jesus Christ. And may the God of peace always be with you.

### Sundays 10am The Message Conversation Study - In Person



#### Mission of the Month: Henderson Settlement



Henderson Settlement began as a result of a murder trial in 1925 in Frakes, KY, when Rev. Hiram Frakes, dismayed at the lawlessness of the people who refused to lay blame for a number of killings in the area, decided to devote his ministry to "the valley people". With

no land or money, he determined to create a school for all children. He went to his bishop, Theodore Henderson, to lay the groundwork for financial support. Land was donated by land owners and a teacher was obtained. Following the birth of the Henderson Settlement School, another school was built and dormitories constructed for orphans and students who lived too far away to walk. These children would do chores to help pay for their education. A community bonded together to build up the Settlement, counteracting the area's reputation for moonshining and feuding. Later a church was constructed, a farm was started, a nurse and dentists came on board, along with electricity and a dirt road – progress made possible by the Methodist Board of Missions and Churches around the country. 
